



Super Learning in a Super City © Educator Frequently Asked Questions



Q: What is Super Learning in Super City?

A: SLSC is the largest youth outreach program in the history of the Super Bowl! It is a school based academic youth outreach program for grades kindergarten through twelve. Super Learning provides an opportunity for *all* students, regardless of socio-economic background or geographic location, to be a part of the Super Bowl. Originally created for SBXXXV, SLSC is designed to encourage students to use education as a source for accomplishing their life goals, learning from role models and heroes beyond the game, and developing character and citizenship that will sustain them through many of the challenges they will face. The K-12 curriculum uses the Super Bowl as an outreach platform to focus on literacy, character education, environmental awareness and community service and pride. Youth, families and educators that participate in the SLSS Incentive Program are eligible for prizes and access to exclusive South Florida Host Committee Super Bowl XLIV and NFL sanctioned events (for more details see the South Florida Host Committee Website: www.southsuperbowl.com and click on Community Outreach).

SLSC's mission is to show how ordinary people can become extraordinary through goal setting, character and education.

Q: How will teachers receive the Super Learning in a Super City materials to use in their classrooms?

A: SLSC is free to all educators. All public, private and home school teachers K-12 in South Florida will be able to download the **FREE CURRICULUM LESSON PLAN GUIDES** for SLSC from the South Florida Host Committee's official website. They will also be able to download the **REWARDS AND CONTEST PROGRAM PACKAGE** that will provide them with information about contests and incentives. Teachers can choose to use some or all of the lessons in the curriculum guide in their classes. All lessons were designed to be stand-alone lessons. Private school and home school teachers can also access curriculum through the Host Committee website. Q: What are the incentives for participating in Super Learning in a Super City?

A: Teachers must register on behalf of their class online and as part of the Rewards and Contests Program as part of their eligibility. They can download the Rewards and Contests Program Packet online at www.southfloridasuperbowl.com and get information regarding contests, rewards and participation in some exciting Super Bowl activities. Teachers who register their classes on behalf of their classes for the Rewards and Contests Program will be eligible for prizes for top performers. No student information is necessary to register.

Q: How does Super Learning in a Super City address State Standards and other academic expectations?

A: Super Learning in a Super State was designed by teachers for teachers. Every lesson integrates the skills and concepts that are detailed in the state standard guides and lessons are also aligned with national standards in the core subject areas. Lessons also include questions that promote the higher order thinking and writing skills necessary to be successful on the high stakes testing requirements in all states. Reading lessons are in alignment with scientifically based reading research best practices and all lessons use high yield instructional strategies that lead to improved student achievement.

Q: How else can schools get involved?

A: Super Learning Captains: SLSC is seeking teachers willing to participate as Super Learning Captains. Captains will assist the Super Learning Program Directors and South Florida Super Bowl Host Committee by implementing the program at their schools and encouraging other teachers to get involved. Captains will attend a limited number of meetings or phone conferences and act as a school contact and communications liaison for the Super Learning Program Directors and the South Florida Super Host Committee.

Super Learning Model Schools: Schools that gain 50% or more teacher participation in the Super Learning program will be eligible for status as a "Super Learning Model School" and receive an official Super Learning in a Super State Model School certificate, as well as special VIP visits.
